Walmart Foundation Grant to Meals On Wheels Association of America to Help Feed Hungry Seniors Served By Local Agency

Grant received at critical time as economy threatens funding for senior programs.

March 3, Waco, TX – Central Texas Senior Ministry has been awarded \$10,800 through a Walmart Foundation grant to the Meals On Wheels Association of America (MOWAA). The money will provide Central Texas Senior Ministry with much-needed equipment for their Senior Nutrition Kitchen, which is critical to continue serving seniors in our neighborhoods.

This financial support is desperately needed as many Meals On Wheels programs across the country are struggling to survive during this economic downturn. The “Walmart Foundation Impact Grant” is intended to help Central Texas Senior Ministry continue to meet the long term equipment needs of providing meals to our seniors in Falls, Hill, McLennan Counties, and the City of Waco.

Last year, many Meals On Wheels programs were forced to change or reduce their services, but the Walmart Foundation stepped in to help restore those meals. This year, the Walmart Foundation is spending more than \$2 million nationwide to make sure Meals On Wheels programs have the equipment they need to maintain their operations into the future.
